Make LOVE Visible

At Right Sharing of World Resources, we believe love grows when we share it. That's the heart of our work — and the invitation of our year-end theme, **Make Love Visible**.

Each RSWR program in Guatemala, India, Kenya, and Sierra Leone is shaped by local needs and traditions, so groups organize their work in slightly different ways. In India, women's groups manage a revolving loan fund and personal savings — practices that strengthen both livelihoods and community bonds.

In southern India, Mrs. Perumalakka meets with her women's group regularly. Every woman contributes a small amount to savings (in addition to loan repayments) — sometimes just twenty-five rupees, less than thirty cents. The money itself is modest, but the meaning is deep. It is a promise to keep showing up, supporting one another through joy and hardship alike.

After five years of personal saving, Mrs. Perumalakka recently received her accumulated funds. She used part to restock her small

shop and part to buy new clothes for her daughter-in-law and grandchildren for Diwali. Out of her quiet strength and steady care, her family and neighbors see what love looks like when it is made visible.

This is the power of the group ritual of personal savings — a small act multiplied by commitment and community. Each coin set aside becomes more than financial security; it becomes trust, connection, and hope. When one woman thrives, others follow.

As this year draws to a close, we invite you to join in this same spirit of sharing. Your gift helps love grow — not just as a feeling, but as action that transforms lives. Just as Mrs. Perumalakka saved less than 30 cents per month, a small contribution can have a lasting impact. 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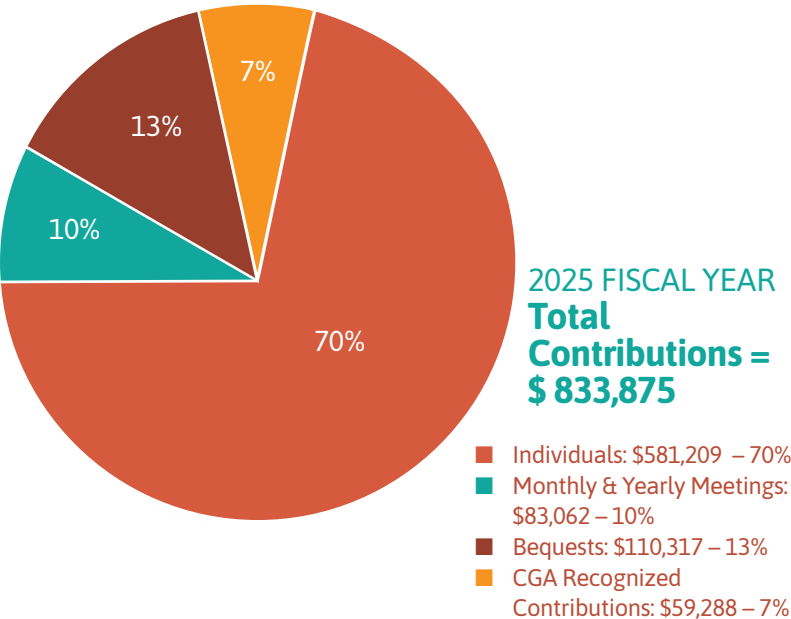
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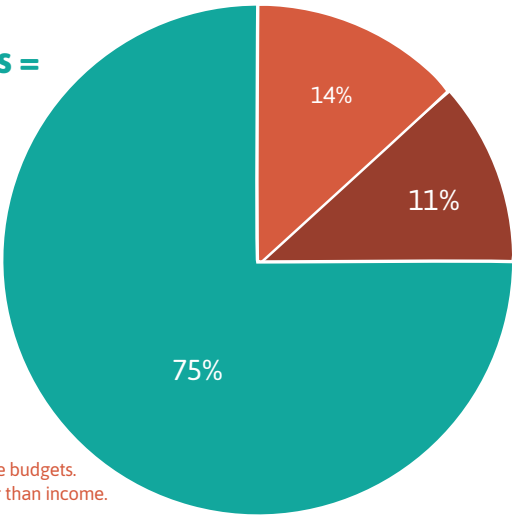
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Financial Summary Fiscal Year 2025

2025 In Review

A NEW PROGRAM MODEL IN FULL MOTION

This was our first full year under RSWR's redesigned program. The new structure allows for training before funding (to better prepare groups to steward their grant), and longer relationships with groups because our experience has shown that change takes time. These two changes will contribute to longer lasting transformation in the communities we partner with. In 2025 RSWR provided training to 31 women's groups and provided seed grants to 22 groups. This

In January, the RSWR team from Guatemala, India, Kenya, Sierra Leone, and the United States gathered outside Kisumu, Kenya for the second convening of the global team. Together, we prepared to provide second grants to some groups in April 2026. Deepening team relationships across countries allows for mutual support and collective innovation as RSWR's vision for community-led change is refined.
